"For the disco, six of our friends, who are DJs, took turns playing '80s and '90s music all night," says Laura. "It was a riotous party and such fun." Any sore heads the next day were eased by a pool party and barbecue.

But Laura and Stephen's wedding journey didn't end there. "We were so inspired by the lovely venue and its incredible owner that we took a bold leap and decided to buy our own venue in England."
